Gabrielle Jamela Hosein is Senior Lecturer at the Institute for Gender and Development Studies, The UWI, St. Augustine. She holds a BA (Hons) from the University of Toronto, an M.Phil. in Gender and Development Studies from the University of the West Indies and a PhD from University College London.

In addition to other publications, she co-edited the study, "Negotiating Gender, Policy and Politics in the Caribbean: Feminist Strategies, Masculinist Resistance and Transformational Possibilities" (2016) and the collection, "Indo-Caribbean Feminist Thought: Genealogies, Theories, Enactments" (2016). She is co-Executive Editor of the journal, *The Caribbean Review of Gender Studies*, published since 2007 by the IGDS. In 2018, she authored the qualitative study of intimate partner violence, *Gender Based Violence in Trinidad and Tobago*, published by UN Women. In 2019, she authored the study *Gender Mainstreaming in National Development Planning*, published by UN ECLAC.

She has been part of Caribbean feminist movement-building for twenty-five years, collaborating with a wide range of women's, men's, youth and LGBTI organisations over these decades. She has been a member of the Council for Responsible Political Behaviour, the Spotlight Programme Civil Society National Reference Group for Trinidad and Tobago, and UWI's representative on the Spotlight Regional Steering Committee.

As a performance poet since 1997, her work extends to spoken word collaborations on gender-based violence prevention across the region. Her current areas of research and advocacy are gender-based violence, masculinities, adolescent sexualities and Indo-Caribbean feminisms. Her blog, *Diary of a Mothering Worker*, has been published weekly as a national newspaper column since 2012.
